TOGETHER IN MISSIONS, MINISTRY, AND FELLOWSHIP



2025 marks the seventy-fifth anniversary of the first Living Nativity at Hayes Barton. The Forum, a young adult group founded in 1936 for study, leadership development, and fellowship, brought the Living Nativity to Hayes Barton. Accounts at the time said that this program was the first outdoor Living Nativity scene in the area and possibly in North Carolina. In its first year the Living Nativity was held on nine consecutive nights with 4 forty-five minute shifts nightly. Raleigh police directed traffic and reported that over the course of the nine nights that approximately 100,000 people viewed the scene; at that time the population of Raleigh was approximately 66,000. A December 26, 1950 News and Observer editorial suggested that, "[Hayes Barton Baptist Church] will discover that in the years to come it has created an expectation of this good spectacle from it which should become a fixed custom of all Christmases here."

CHRISTMAS MISSIONS OFFERING

SERVICE OF REMEMBRANCE

This time of reflection and worship will offer a meaningful way of remembering your loss and honoring your personal grief process. Please invite coworkers, friends, and family members who may find this service meaningful as they grieve during the Christmas season.

A time of gathering, conversation, and refreshments will be held in Hailey Hall following the service. Childcare will be provided during the service.

Chrismon Tree

During the weeks of Advent, our Chrismon tree draws our attention to many aspects of the life and work of our Lord Jesus Christ. This week, we are highlighting the design known as "God is Love." It is easily recognizable in the shape of a heart and incorporates a cross design, to speak of the love of God that brought us redemption through Jesus Christ. The scriptures teach that the cross was in the heart of God from the foundation of the world (Revelation 13:8).
