

2026 CUBA MISSION TRIP

Consider joining the work of Baptist on Mission in Cuba during the week of July 31-August 7. The partnership's primary purpose is to construct seminary buildings in Santa Clara, Cuba, as well as maintenance/construction at the retirement home in Santiago. The cost for the trip is \$1423 and includes airfare, lodging, most meals, transportation, and project costs. A \$200 non-refundable deposit is due by Wednesday, April 22.
