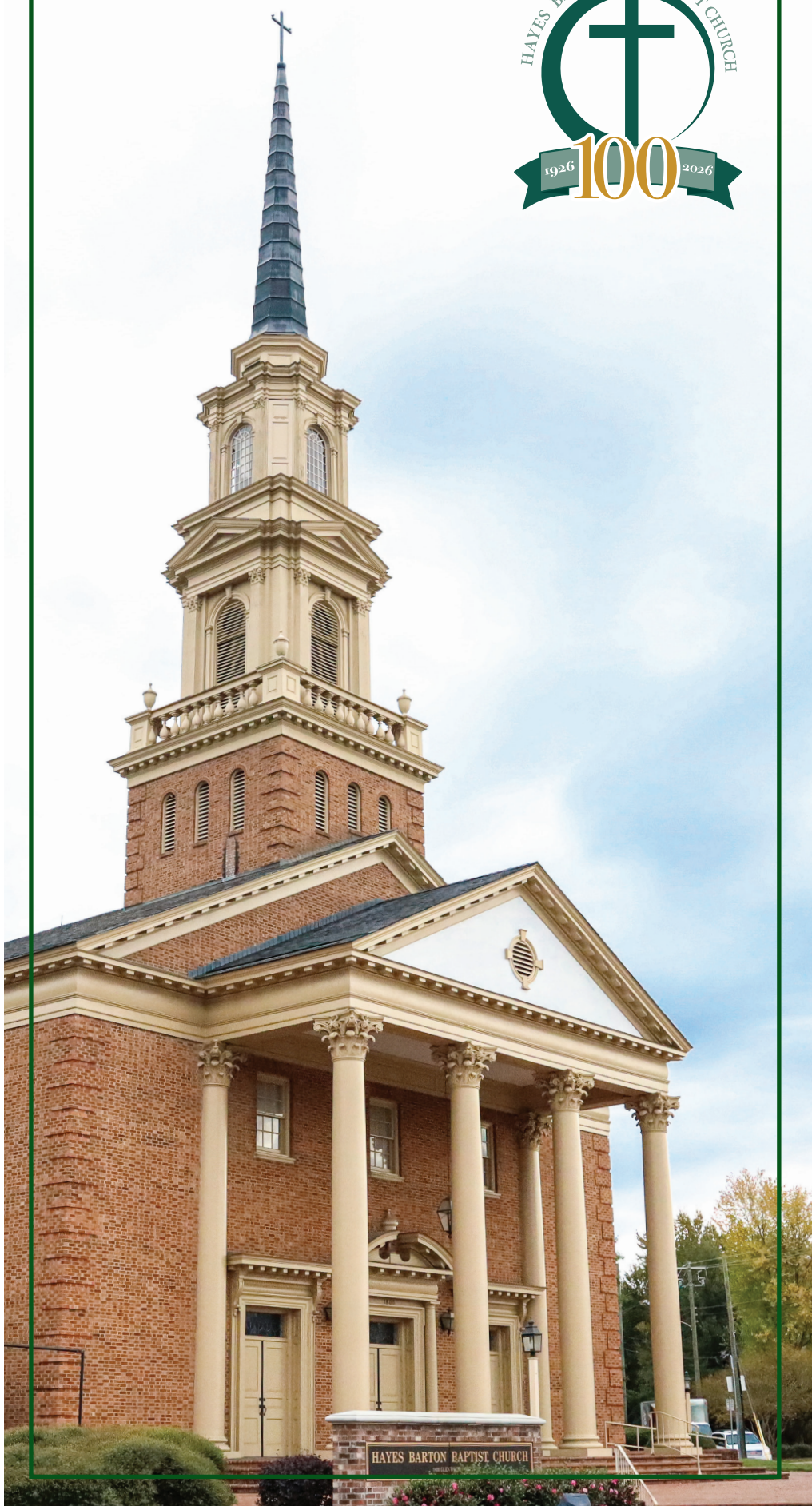

SIGN THE CENTENNIAL CHARTER
