The television ministry has been a significant outreach of Hayes Barton. It may come as a surprise that in 1954 is the first record of a possibility of televising Hayes Barton's services. WRAL radio contacted HBBC and other local churches to assess their interest in broadcasting worship services if WRAL TV was granted a television license. The potential cost of \$1,170 for facility upgrades and the uncertainty of Raleigh's television future postponed any plans for Hayes Barton. For context, WNAO, the first station in the Raleigh market, broadcast from 1953-1957, and the first broadcast by WRAL was on December 15, 1956. It was not until October 9, 1988, that Hayes Barton implemented its weekly television ministry. Since then, the 11:00 AM Sunday worship services have been broadcast on several different television outlets in the area; in 2026, the broadcast is on the CW network.

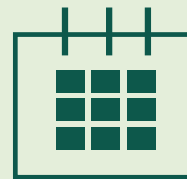
