The first use of what is now known as the “Friendship Pad” was in January 1997, when the pad was referred to as “Who’s Who in the Pew?” Dr. Hailey, in announcing the new means of registering worship attendance, said that “we have not stooped so low as to provide ‘doodling pads’ for bored worshippers. After all, one pad per pew would hardly be sufficient.” The goal was, and still is, to have a record of all who worship in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings. It helps let the church know who is attending worship and can provide contact information for visitors and those wishing communication from a staff member or minister. In recent years the church has offered an online Friendship Pad so that members of the broadcast congregation can record attendance and send messages or prayer requests.

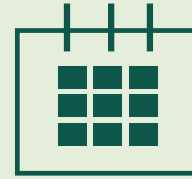
