Traffic issues in the Five Points area have been a perennial problem for motorists and pedestrians alike. Hayes Barton's second pastor, Dr. Louis S. Gaines, wrote a letter to the editor that appeared in the May 13, 1933, News and Observer, complaining about the Five Points intersection. He said that directions seem confusing and that it seems to be "Every fellow for himself, and the devil take the hindmost." He wondered where the pedestrian fits in the scheme and worried for the number of children that traverse the intersection and for pedestrians who are forced to deal with "speeding cars, trucks, and motorcycles dodging and ducking about to avoid collision." Dr. Gaines didn't believe a traffic signal would work and suggested stationing a traffic officer in the center of the intersection to direct traffic; he also suggested adding a "safety island" at least sixteen feet in diameter and at least ten inches in height. In retrospect, the ideas of Dr. Gaines and many since then have yet to make the intersection a safe place to walk or to drive.

STEPUP MINISTRY MISSION

StepUp Ministry is a three-step program that provides pathways for people to overcome barriers and transform lives by providing employment prep assistance, life skills, and long-term connections to support growth personally and professionally.

- **Employment Academy** - teaching job readiness: resume writing, interviewing skills, and how to dress for success, along with connecting participants with employers who provide livable wages.
- **Life Skills Program** - a 48-week-long program where participants are paired with co-partners who walk alongside the participant, holding them accountable through the four phases as they learn financial literacy, goal setting, developing communication tools, and more.
- After graduation, participants have the option to join the Alumni Group, where participants can stay connected and continue to grow personally and professionally with the help of various community partners.

IN-PERSON | September 18-19

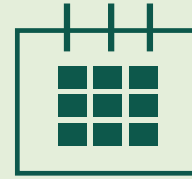
