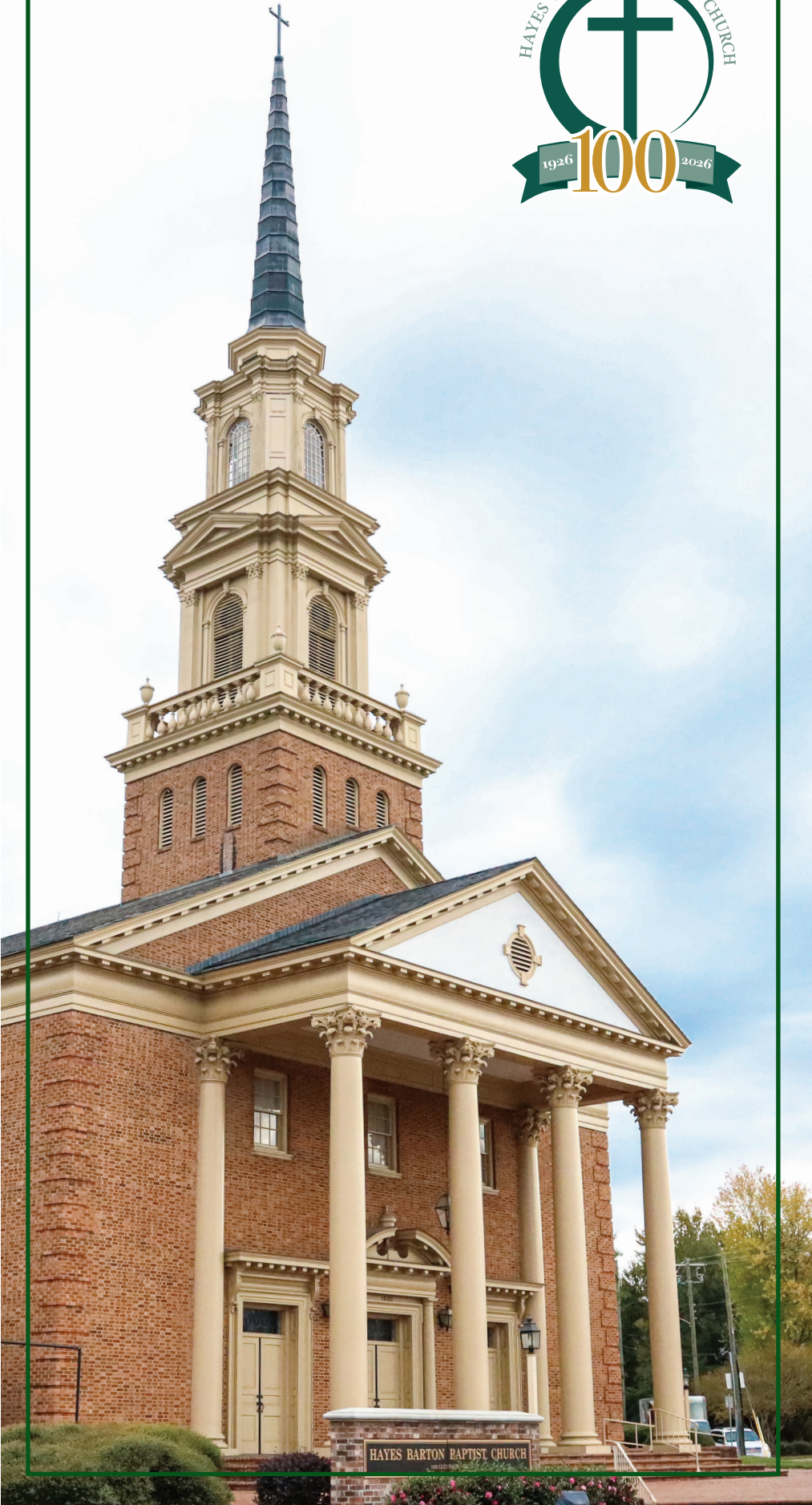

OWN A PIECE OF HAYES BARTON HISTORY

For nearly 60 years, the slate on our church roof has sheltered this congregation through worship, celebration, grief, and growth. When we replaced our roof, we were able to save some pieces to offer members the chance to take a piece of that history home. The slate is available in three sizes. Each slate has one of four meaningful designs: the Church Logo, the Centennial Logo, the Image of the Church, or Dr. Hailey's Benediction. These make a beautiful keepsake for longtime members, a meaningful gift for someone who grew up at Hayes Barton, or a special memento of the church's century of faith. The slate can be pre-ordered at hbbc.org. Payment is due at the time of purchase. There are additional fees if you want your piece mailed to you. We will also have them available for purchase on Sunday mornings from June 21-July 19.
