This week marks the thirtieth anniversary of Dr. David J. Hailey's ministry as pastor of Hayes Barton Baptist Church. In the July 24, 1996, Newsletter column — only three days after he preached his first sermon at HBBC — Dr. Hailey wrote of his intentions as he embarked on the journey of leading the HBBC congregation:

I want you to know that I meant what I said on Sunday morning. With God being my helper, I will seek to be the kind of pastor that you need. I will love you to the best of my ability. I will pray for you regularly. I will be with you when you need me. I will preach and teach the Bible faithfully. I will listen to you carefully. And I will lead you gently. This is my promise. It is a promise I take seriously. I am obligated to God. I am obligated to you.

Dr. Hailey, everyone in the Hayes Barton Baptist Church family thanks you for meeting and exceeding every promise you expressed to us three decades ago. We rejoice with you on your thirty-year milestone and are deeply grateful for your continuing ministry among us.

This list is based on the following criteria:

1. You have been a member for at least two years.
2. You are at least 18 years old.
3. You have been faithful in your giving.
4. You attended in person at least 24 Sundays during the worship hour between July 13, 2025-June 28, 2026. Worship hour attendance also includes your participation in church retreats, HBBC-sponsored mission trips, or other duties during the worship hour.
5. Your spouse is not serving on the Diaconate in 2027.
6. You have not served on the Diaconate in the past two years.

Each slate has one of four meaningful designs: the Church Logo, the Centennial Logo, the Image of the Church, or Dr. Hailey's Benediction. The slate can be pre-ordered at hbhc.org. CENTENNIAL TIMELINE

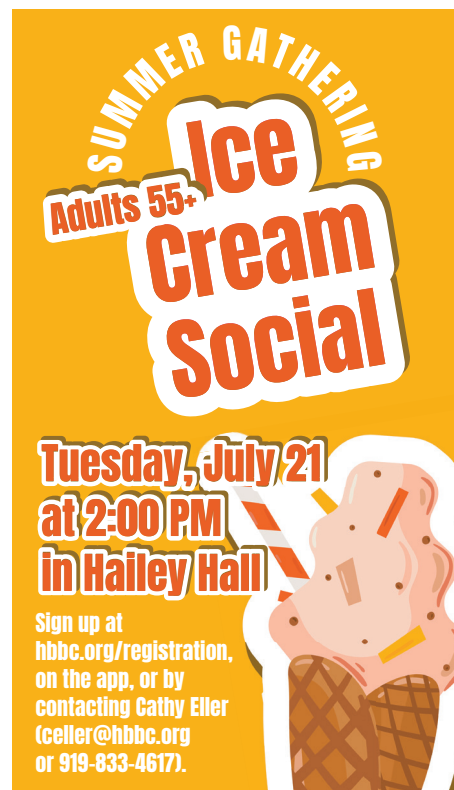

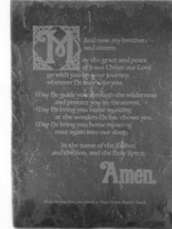
PRAYER SHAWL OR LAP BLANKET

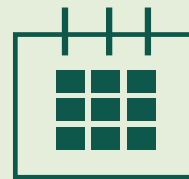
